BACKGROUND

Following the Hamas massacre of October 7, all segments of Israeli society are under attack. This is especially true for Israel's academics. The academic year has been irreparably interrupted, with college and university students, faculty and staff alike pressed into military service to defend the country. The isolation and boycott threat faced by Israeli academics is real. Scholars now face difficulties getting their academic papers reviewed and grants approved. Post-doctoral or visiting faculty positions have been suspended due to a resurgence of the Boycott, Divestment and Sanctions (BDS) movement. While it is incumbent upon all Jews and friends of Israel to stand up and be counted, it is especially important for academics at leading universities worldwide to support our Israeli colleagues.

BOYCOTTS

Boycotts take many forms. Exclusion of Israelis from professional societies. Exclusion of Israelis from professional conferences. Refusal of other academics to review promotion dossiers or manuscripts of Israelis ("soft boycotts"). These boycotts are devastating to the Israeli academy. Young scholars depend on reviews of their work and







dossiers by international experts. Universities in Israel depend on reviews to maintain their international standing. Students and postdocs need access to training in elite internationally-recognized universities and institutions to advance their careers. We must oppose all forms of boycotts and provide opportunities for Israeli academics to remain integrated with the international academic community. 

The Hella and Derrick Kleeman Professorial Chair of Biochemistry

Born in Be'er-Sheva, Prof. Ziv Reich received his BSc from Ben-Gurion University of the Negev in 1988. He earned his MSc in 1990 and his PhD degree in 1995, both from the Department of Organic Chemistry at the Weizmann Institute. Following postdoctoral research at Stanford University, he joined the Institute in 1998. Prof. Reich was appointed Vice President in December, 2019. He is the incumbent of the Hella and Derrick Kleeman Professorial Chair of Biochemistry.

Prof. Reich's studies include transport of molecules and macromolecules between the cell nucleus and cytoplasm, protein folding and binding, structure, function and adaptation of photosynthetic membranes, and the molecular basis of chloroplast development and leaf senescence—processes of major significance for agriculture. He is also elucidating the mechanisms that allow plants to withstand harsh environmental conditions, primarily water deficiency, towards developing drought-resistant crops.

His lab also investigates the origin and evolution of diversity in microbial populations, asking questions related to their diversity over time, how the environmental history of the community affects the breadth of possible individual traits, and when a transient change in an individual become a permanent trait in the population. He addresses these questions using directed-evolution experiments and data analysis based on deep learning and mathematical modeling. His research on the evolution of diversity, in addition to providing insight into key scientific questions, may shed light on medical topics related to cellular heterogeneity such as bacterial resistance to antibiotics and cancer resistance to chemotherapy, and may inform the management of biodiversity in the face of environmental changes.

Prof. Reich received the Sir Charles Clore Prize (1993), the Gerhard Schmidt Prize in Chemistry (1997), the Rothschild Postdoctoral Fellowship (1995), the Yigal Allon Fellowship (1998), the Teva Pharmaceuticals Award (2001), and the Morris L. Levinson Prize in Biology (2005). He was elected an EMBO Young Investigator at 2001.

Prof. Reich is married and the father of three.
